We want our citizens to reach their full potential in whatever field they choose. It makes sense then to start at the very beginning. Children should have the same opportunity to work in spaces which pay attention to all their educational needs, and that includes art.

Our community is fortunate that educational leadership across the board recognizes the "super value" that the arts bring to all our children. The Boyle County Schools have just dedicated a beautiful arts center available to enhance programming for the district. The Danville Independent Schools declared Art in Schools Month with a comprehensive collaborative approach throughout the system.

Recent renovations and new construction in school buildings across the county and city districts took into consideration the importance of a creative environment for children to "work" in every day.

Taking art to new levels is a community effort. The school systems will be joining forces to present two weeks of summer arts camps. One week, held at Danville High School's Gravely Hall Performing Arts Center, will focus on grades 1 – 6. The second week, at Boyle Performing Arts Center, will serve 7th– 12th grade students.

On May 10th, Danville Sings' Resonance Men's Choir and Sounding Joy Women's Choir under the direction of Barbara Hall, will present its first spring concert in nearly three years. The concert will be held at the Boyle County Performing Arts Center and will feature the Danville High School Choir directed by Scott Walker. 
April brings Farmer's Market and **NEW** art opportunities
