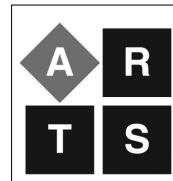

## We have a *Seat* for you!

The Arts Commission Gallery in the Schoolhouse is the scene of a long running quilt restoration project in need of volunteers. Before Covid, the Arts Commission along with the Pieceable Friends Quilt Guild, began to restore and complete a 1930's era quilt belong-

ing to a family in Perryville. On Saturday mornings during Farmer's Market, volunteers designed, cut, assembled, and hand stitched new blocks to square off the large top. Historically correct fabrics were obtained from privately owned collections and reproduction fabrics

The Arts Commission has long been a part of the Great American Brass Band Festival weekend.

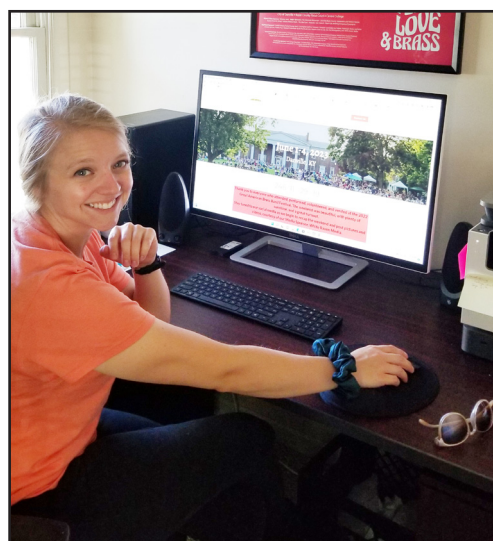
The Gallery Hop traditionally begins the fun with an evening of art as dozens of artists are hosted by downtown businesses to meet and greet visitors and shoppers.

## Leadership Boyle samples Arts and Culture

The Chamber of Commerce Leadership Boyle County Program is on schedule with its 2022-2023 class of 20 local leaders in fields which include business, civic and non-profit organizations, and education institutions. The participants meet monthly all year to take a thorough, behind the scenes look at all the programs and people that contribute to our

community life.

One of the most popular days is the Arts and Culture experience, held this year on November 15th. During the day, the leadership teams will visit 11 locations and hear presentations by 33 persons representing festivals, galleries, arts related businesses, theaters, historic sites, arts classes, public art, and performing arts groups.
