The Arts Commission was established, in part, to provide opportunities for artists to develop their skills whether professionally or personally. Over the years, the Danville area has become well known as


home to many prominent working artists such as David Farmer, Stephen Powell, Sheldon Tapley, Brook White, and many, many others.
