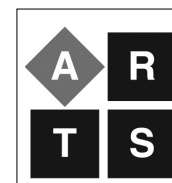

Dear Friends,

The Arts Commission operates on a calendar fiscal year. This is practical from an accounting stand point. But in our program world, we can take a bit of a breath right about now. I thought I would take this opportunity to fill you in on how we do what we do with your support in 2023.

The Arts Commission divides its mission into four areas of focus.

**Artists and cultural activities (20%)** which includes exhibits at the Schoolhouse in Constitution Square, the Gallery Hop, developing artist opportunities at Farmer's Market, Arts Citizen of the Year, and the Constitution Square Festival.

**Youth and Special Needs of the Community (50%)** which includes the school play projects, monthly youth arts exhibits, art and book kits during Spring Break and Summer, scholarships, Neighborhood Concerts, the Louise Wilkinson high school grants, the Episcopal Church Day Camp, and programs for special needs young adults.

**Technical Support (15%)** which includes fiscal sponsorship services for Scarlet Cup Theater, the Danville Sings Community Choirs, the Heritage Area String Program, and the Pieceable Friends Quilt Guild.

**Information and Collaboration (15%)** which includes the Chamber Arts and Cultural Day, the monthly newsletter, weekly radio spot, articles for the newspaper, presentations to local and state organizations, social media and website maintenance.

The Arts Commission budget for Fiscal Year 2023 is \$35,400.00. Direct, out-of-pocket expenses for our focus areas totals approximately \$13,200.00.

That leaves just over \$22,000.00 for overhead expenses such as salary, rent, office supplies and fundraising costs. Allocation of overhead cost is reflected in the percentage of time dedicated to each focus area.

So, how do we pay for all this activity? Approximately \$10,200.00 is received for specific projects such as the Book and Art Kits, the school plays, some scholarships and grants, and the Neighborhood concerts. Approximately \$8,000.00 is received through appropriations from city, county and state government sources. The remaining \$17,200.00 comes from unrestricted contributions received from our donors and friends, and fundraisers such as the annual BlueGrass Good Giving Campaign. We are also the recipients of in-kind contributions of some services such as equipment rentals and exhibit spaces.

Many years ago, the Board set out to serve this community through advancing arts opportunities. The mission has remained true to the ideal that "Arts are Vital." I hope this mid-year reflection illustrates our continued commitment to our community. We welcome your comments and questions at any time!
