# Thank you, Charlotte

As a child living on her family's farm, Charlotte Henson probably had no idea the turns her life would take. However, her early life definitely tells the story of the characteristics which would serve her, and her community well. Charlotte was an avid reader, a gifted singer, a teacher, a wife, a mother and a grandmother. Her family readily admits she

was stubborn. In the best sense of the word.

When Charlotte met Eben Henson, he was setting out to bring Broadway to the Bluegrass. What began as a dream of a local theater, at the time housed at the free space at Darnell State Mental Hospital, grew into Pioneer Playhouse. The Playhouse will celebrate its 75th

year of productions this summer.

In the true spirit of theater, "the show must go on," the Playhouse figured out ways to safely perform during Covid. Following the death of founder Eben Henson in 2004, and in 2012 the loss of artistic director, Holly Henson, Charlotte never questioned the future of the theater and continued to work as she always had.

Most of the time, Charlotte was the behind the scenes backbone of the theater operation. She coordinated staffing, housing, meals, daily organization, maintenance, and handled the hundreds of play production issues which were necessary to present a season of entertaining experiences for audiences. The public generally had no idea the role she played in the success of the theater every day, all

However, every performance night for many years, Charlotte's musical talent was a feature during the pre-show dinner. She entertained the dinner quests with songs, accompanying herself on guitar, and stories about the Playhouse. John Jacob Niles once called Charlotte's voice one of the purest he had ever heard.

While often not publicly recognized, Charlotte was named the 2006 Arts Citizen of the Year by the Arts Commission.

Though her health and strength were fading, Charlotte continued to be involved in the direction of the theater. She sang at dinners even in the summer of 2023 and the play schedule for the summer of 2024, the 75th season, is already well planned. As her family said, "the show must go on."

Charlotte Henson died on Feb. 13th, 2024, at her home at Pioneer Playhouse.

# Bluebirds will flock to Danville this spring

The Garden Club of Danville is about more than just pretty flowers. While your own backyard is a good place to learn and experiment with plants and vegetables for your family dinner table, the Garden Club mission includes emphasis on preserving and developing the local environment to benefit the local community.

Bluebirds are important in the Eastern United States. They feed on the insects which are harmful to food crops. During the nesting and hatching season, they eat voraciously and gather insects to feed their newborn chicks.

The Garden Club of Danville has initiated a Bluebird House project to install 30 Bluebird houses

along the trail on Clark's Run. To accomplish the goal, the club was fortunate to have Will Wilson of Scout Troop 119 join in for his Eagle Scout project. To date, Will has constructed the 30 houses, along with Preston Miles has scouted the locations along the trail, club members have painted the houses, and Will and some friends will install the houses by the beginning of March.

Bluebirds begin house hunting in early March and the club and Will have a beautiful neighborhood ready for immediate occupancy. Club members will provide housekeeping services at the end of the season and document the number of hatchings in each house.
