

The Arts Commission supports local arts organizations by partnering in their programs. As part of our mission, we present concerts or performances featuring young artists to encourage their participation in art and to inform the public about the programs available around the community. Again, in 2025, the Arts Commission arranged for performances on the Constitution Square stage prior to the Main Stage performances of Brass Band 1st Thursday series.



Recognizing and encouraging student leaders in the arts and community

The Arts Commission has several programs which encourage students to explore the arts. The Louise Wilkinson grant provides funds to local high schools for innovative art projects.

Students have created quilts and wall art from recycled and repurposed materials, used old book pages for line art, painted silk fabric for ceiling pieces at the BCPAC, experimented with the slump glass process, and much more. High School Students present original plays for Middle School students and serve as camp counselors.

Students have the opportunity to publicize their projects during the Arts Commission's regular segment on the Joe Mathis show on Thursday mornings. Seen here is Lilly Bratcher who will be launching a dance program at Toliver Elementary School and is a member of the Maple Avenue Skeleton crew as part of her art program!

Recently, the Arts Commission added the Kentucky Review of Art to our program of fiscal sponsorship. The Review is a highly professional arts publication entirely run by high school students!
