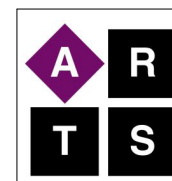

It is widely recognized that this community is home to an extraordinary number of individuals who excel in their work as artists, and those who make art possible. It is the honor and privilege of the Arts Commission to formally name the Arts Citizen(s) of the

Year. The individuals who are recognized are not selected for their work in just one year, rather for a lifetime of work often in multiple disciplines and settings, through twists and turns.

This year, the Board has selected David Farmer and

Paula Meckes as co-honorees. As has been the custom for several years, the awards will be presented at the first meeting of the Danville City Commission in the new year. The public is invited to attend the presentation which will be on January 12th at 4:30 in the City Hall Chamber. The presentation will be followed by a reception in the City Hall Conference Room.

David Farmer, while not a professional artist all his life, knew very early that art was what he loved. As a young child he was drawn to color and would be happiest with a box of colors and some paper. He studied art in college, but did not complete a degree. Through various occupations, a stint in the Army, a college degree in English, he always knew he wanted to paint. He painted in his home

studio, presented exhibits, sold in galleries.

Following retirement from a state office job, he devotes his time to painting, now out of a studio in the Art Center of the Bluegrass.

Paula Meckes is not a native of Kentucky, but landed here after being assigned to Kentucky School for the Deaf as a student teacher. Shortly after completing her degree in Deaf Education from Illinois State University, Paula was offered a position at KSD. She taught at the school for 35 years. While dance was not her major in college, she completed nearly all requirements for a minor in the program leading her to incorporate the arts in much of her work with the students at KSD. She coordinated the Middle School and High School art programs, helped present plays

on campus and engaged the students in local community art.

Paula has spent many years choreographing with West T. Hill Theater, Danville High School and Middle School. Currently, she is the co-coordinator for the City of Danville Dance program at the Jennie Rogers Community Center serving 75 - 80 children each term. She was the founder of the original program over 30 years ago.

Each year the honorees select a program to which the Arts Commission makes a donation in their name. David has chosen the Humane Society and Paula has chosen the KSD Charitable Foundation to provide funding for KSD students to attend professional arts performances.
